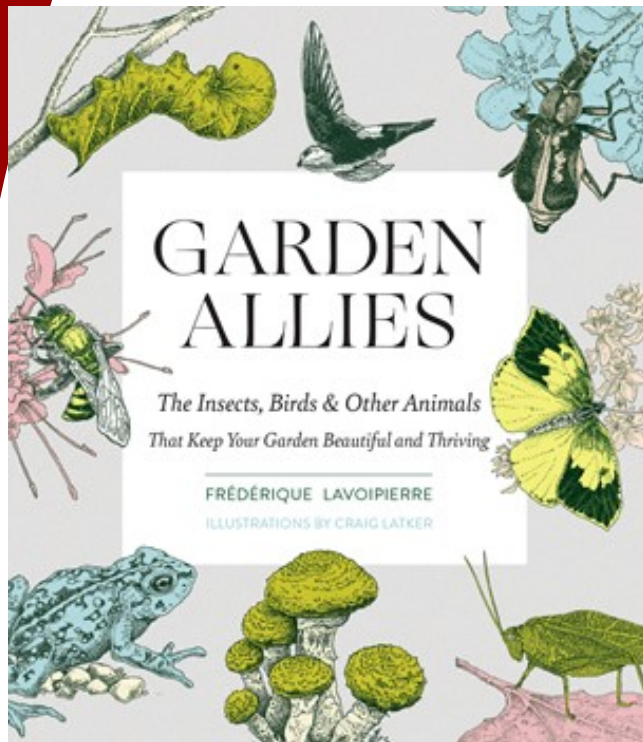

"Garden Allies: The Insects, Birds, and Other Animals That Keep Your Garden Beautiful and Thriving"



Frederique Lavoipierre, as director of education at the Santa Barbara Botanical Garden, shared her enthusiasm for native plants and insects. Frederique has a strong background in entomology, sustainable landscapes and teaching as well as a knowledge of heirloom vegetables and culinary herbs from around the world. Following a brief introduction to conservation biological control and its benefits, she introduces life in the soil, pollinators and other flower visitors, predators and parasites.

Her PowerPoint presentation is brought to life with photography of insects and garden habitats, illustrations from the book, and relevant anecdotes. The slide deck relies primarily on photos and illustrations, with a minimum of text on slides. Following a brief introduction to conservation biological control and its benefits, she introduces life in the soil, pollinators and other flower visitors, predators and parasites, other common garden insects, spiders and other non-insect arthropods, and vertebrates. She will provide a few essential resources before taking questions.
