

Minutes of the October 4, 2021 general meeting of the Evening Garden Club

The speaker was Dr. Linda Chalker-Scott of Puyallup Research and Extension Center, Washington State University. Her emphasis is using scientific research results for horticultural myth busting. She has written several books, many brochures, a gardening blog, and a Great Courses class. Her talk for us was *Gardening in a Changing Climate, What to do, and what to avoid.*

Former president Dan Edge was given a gift certificate to Garland Nursery and a presidential gift certificate in honor of his service to the club. Five other Garland gift certificates were given out to members during the meeting as door prizes.


Dues are due by January 1. They can be paid any time before then.
