A garden in memory...




In the early spring of last year, LeAnna Trosen contacted me to add my garden to the list of summer tours for EGC members to enjoy. I was thrilled to be asked but couldn't schedule any dates due to the cleanup I faced from being absent in the garden for an extended period of time. Summer, then Fall, came and went and time ran out for our well intentioned plans. Fast forward and my husband and I decided that the time had come to move on to something smaller and more manageable so we could enjoy more of what life has to offer! So our house went on the market in February, will close in April, and now the garden is just a cherished memory.




